

South Dakota State of the Tribes Address

January 14th, 2026. Pierre, SD. South Dakota's State Capitol rang loud with the voices of tribal leaders from all nine of its respective Indian reservation. Rosebud's own President Wooden Knife provided the keynote address which brought to light the many issues facing Indian country today. Among those tribal president's present were Frank Star Comes Out, Oglala Sioux Tribe; Peter Lengkeek, Crow Creek Sioux Tribe; Chelaine knudsen, Yankton Sioux Tribe; Ryman LeBeau, Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe; J. Garrett Renville, Sisseton Wahpeton Tribe, and Anthony Reider, Flandreau Sioux Tribe. Those attending from the Rosebud Sioux Tribal Council were Michele Hollow Horn Bear, Tamaleon Wilcox, Marion Little Thunder, Alvin Bear Heels, with Tribal Secretary Tonia Marshall, Treasurer Wayne Boyd, and Vice President Lisa White Pipe. After the State of the Tribal Nations address Governor Larry Rhoden remarked "in all the history of my service to the State of South Dakota and my years served with the legislature I have not seen, until today, this amount of tribal leaders and tribal advocates attending today's event. It is a promise of a good start with tribal and state relations. I hope we can keep the momentum going!" The Rosebud Sioux Tribe applauded the efforts of the SD Indian Affairs Secretary Algin Young in making this event a success.



Bringing Tribal IDs to Our Relatives: Rosebud Sioux Tribe Enrollment Office in Minnesota

Earlier this month, RST Enrollment staff traveled to Minnesota to assist Rosebud Sioux Tribal members who live away from home, providing on-site services with a focus on issuing tribal identification cards. The timing of the visit was especially important. With ongoing ICE raids creating uncertainty and fear in many communities, having proper identification can make a critical difference. Tribal IDs help affirm citizenship, establish identity, and provide peace of mind for members navigating daily life during an already stressful time. Throughout the visit, Enrollment staff worked directly with our off-reservation members to process paperwork, verify records, and issue IDs, answering questions and offering support along the way. The effort reflects the Tribe's ongoing commitment to serving its people wherever they are—not just within reservation boundaries.

The Rosebud Sioux Tribe will continue to look for ways to reach members living off the reservation and ensure they have access to essential services.

ENROLLMENT APPLICATION: APPLICANTS ORIGINAL BIRTH CERTIFICATE, COPY OF THE APPLICANT SOCIAL SECURITY CARD AND PICTURE ID FOR THE PARENT/APPLICANT.

***Applicant must sign if 18 years and older.**

A SACRED BELONGING OF CHIEF HOLLOW HORN BEAR RETURNS HOME

January 7, 2026. Rosebud S.D.

A historic saddle blanket returned to Hollow Horn Bear tiospaye after 120 years.

Tribal leaders gathered for the ceremony, including President Wooden Knife; Cultural Liaison, Russell Eagle Bear; Peter Gibbs; Chief Duane Hollow Bear; RST Treasurer; Wayne Boyd, and RST Secretary; Tonia Marshall. The ceremony started with a prayer from Spiritual Leader, Richard Moves Camp. According to historical material, the saddle blanket was presented to a family in Washington D.C., during the inauguration of Former President, Theodore Roosevelt, in the early 1900's. This is a key moment in history for the Rosebud Sioux Tribe and the Hollow Horn Bear descendants now that the blanket has returned home.




54th Annual Founders Day Wacipi 2026


Jan 30th – 31st & Feb 1st, 2026, Mission S.D.




